Medication abortion and miscarriage care typically involve the use of a 2-medication regimen including **mifepristone** (which blocks the production of progesterone, an essential hormone in pregnancy development) and misoprostol (which induces contractions and expels the contents of the uterus). The Supreme Court could limit access to mifepristone, **jeopardizing miscarriage** care and self-managed abortions, which elevate privacy, agency, and accessibility.

Both mifepristone and misoprostol were approved by the FDA 23 years ago and have been used in the US and around the world for abortion and miscarriage care with 98% effectiveness. Studies show that both drugs are safer than Tylenol and penicillin!

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

Despite decades of research showing that medication abortion is safe and effective, anti-abortion activists are attempting to use the court system to overturn FDA approval of mifepristone. This is a political action with no grounding in medical science.
